Cooperation with your united fund is no one-way street. Scouting recognizes its responsibility to give enthusiastic support. How? Here are ways some Scouters have helped: Help recruit campaign personnel and take an active role in the campaign's key positions; recruit and help Scout parents and friends to cooperate; assist in the campaign office; carry on a year-round educational program; organize and conduct speakers' bureaus; assist in the public relations program; help organize rural areas for the united fund; serve as division or team leaders; organize exhibits and demonstrations.

Site for the 12th World Jamboree, August 1-9, 1967, will be Farragut State Park, Idaho. This will be the first quadrennial world jamboree to be held in the United States. Approximately 17,000 Scouts from nearly 100 countries are expected. About 5,000 members of the Boy Scouts of America will be accepted.

Congratulations to the Salvation Army, 100 years old this year. The Salvation Army brings Scouting to 7,299 boys through its 377 Scout units: 113 packs, 236 troops, and 28 Explorer posts. Most of these serve boys in the congested inner-city areas where the need is great.

The 8th Jamboree-on-the-Air will begin Saturday, October 16, at 0001 hours, Greenwich mean time, and end at 2359 G.m.t. on Sunday, October 17. Scouts and former Scouts, hams or not, may participate. Non hams should seek cooperation of amateur radio operators or radio clubs. FCC regulations must be observed.

Code or voice transmissions may be used. Enter by calling "CQ Jamboree" or answer another station using this call. On cw, use the call "CQ Jam." You may use cw, am, ssb, or any mode authorized.

The Boy Scouts World Bureau station VE3WSB and the Boys' Life Amateur Radio Club station K2BFW will be on the air. K2BFW will be on 3,560 kc., 7,050 kc., and 14,110 kc., all cw, and the following phone frequencies, depending upon conditions: 15-meter band, 21,300 kcs.; 20-meter band, 14,300 kcs.; 40-meter band, 7,290 kcs.; 80-meter band, 3,950 kcs.

Randall R. Burt, 14, awarded the Honor Medal for heroic lifesaving by the National Court of Honor last year for saving the life of a swimming companion, was presented the Bronze Medal for Heroism and \$500 by the Carnegie Hero Fund Commission in June of this year.

National Children's Book Week, sponsored by the Children's Book Council, Inc., will be celebrated October 31-November 6. Its purpose is to encourage children's reading and endorsement of good books.

Explorers Robert Biggers, 17, of Whittier, Calif., and Bruce Nappi, 18, of Kensington, Conn., spent last July and August as junior scientific aides at America's northernmost Arctic Research Laboratory at Point Barrow, Alaska, on the shore of the Arctic Ocean. Both are from posts sponsored by Kiwanis clubs.

At the laboratory, operated for the Office of Naval Research by the University of Alaska, the Explorers had opportunities to become acquainted with and participate in a number of physical and biological sciences.

Biggers plans a career in medicine or medical research; Nappi, in aeronautical engineering. Each is an Eagle Scout, holder of the Scouting religious award from his church, and a leader in his school and post.

The National Council, Boy Scouts of America, in cooperation with 12 local councils has launched a program to extend the effectiveness of Scouting in rural and inner-city areas considered to be disadvantaged. The program will include study, experimentation, and evaluation of our methods in the more difficult areas. The national committee in charge of this program is Charles B. 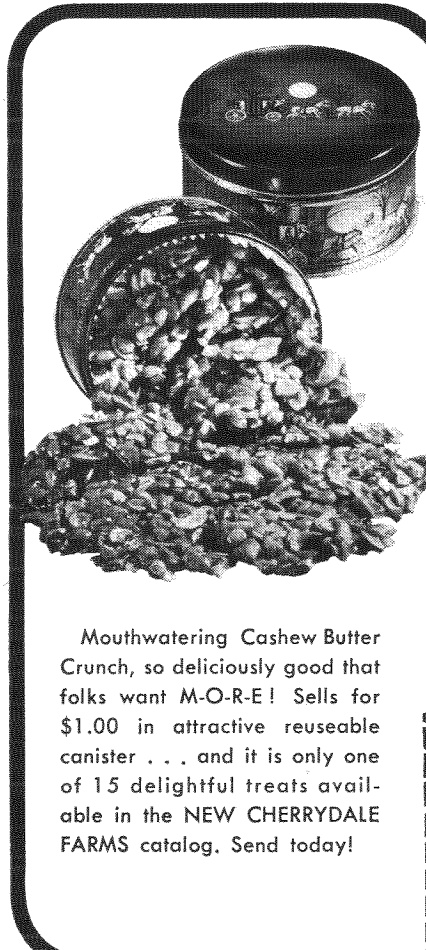
